Each story uses a physical activity setting and is written specifically for physical education teachers as a tool to help them reach their learners. Each unit closes with a list of NASPE standards and sample performance outcomes that the unit addresses, as well as child-friendly complementary "I can" statements. The book and CD-ROM package is set up as a toolkit to allow you to use all the units or choose the units that fit best with your program.
