logical dependence according to which logic depends on God's will and with theistic logical independence according to which logic is independent of God. These rival views can be seen as the horns of the Logiphro dilemma: either logic depends on God's will in which case special revelation would no longer be communicable or logic is independent of God in which case core claims of classical theism for example that God is the only independent being would be violated. The best way to escape both of these horns according to McGlothlin is to adopt the nonstandard form of theistic logical dependence.
