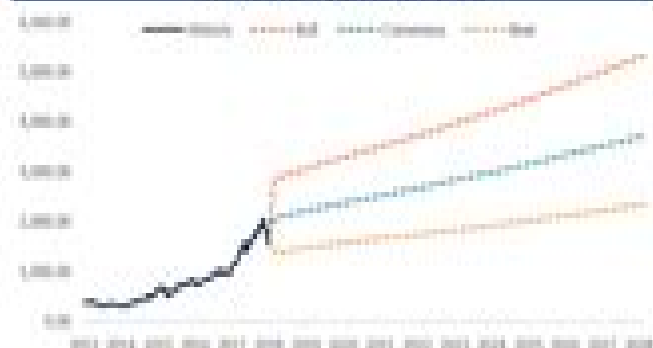

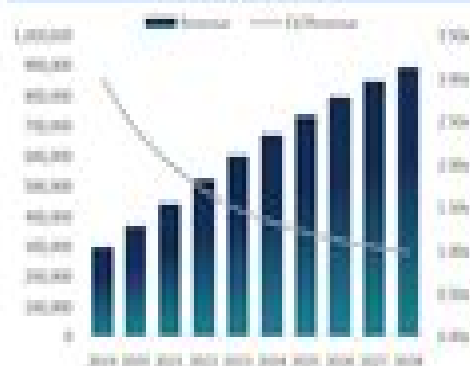

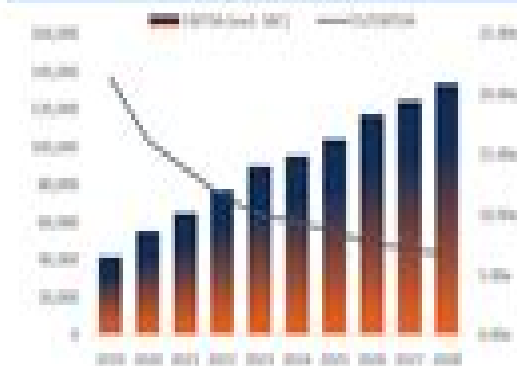
Share Price Chart - Historical and Forecast
