Financing Africa's Cities Thierry Paulais, 2012-07-05 This volume addresses the issues of financing urban growth of the African continent which has the highest urban growth rate on the planet in the next decades Considerable investment will be needed to sustain this level of growth and to clear up accumulated backlogs At the same time decentralization has resulted in increased responsibilities for local government but in most cases institutional reforms were carried out without the transfer of a sufficient level of resources and local capacities in governance and project management are weak Which mechanisms will finance these extensive needs and how will African local governments meet these needs Specifics on how to finance African cities have not been studied The actual scale of this market has not been fully grasped A systemic approach to this market is difficult because of its diversity country size institutional context characteristics of urban network availability of capital market currency etc and a lack of data Donors assistance methods in the sector are disparate marked by disputes between different schools of thought special purpose vehicles created by donors operate according to a variety of methods and with wide ranging and sparsely disseminated results What is the best way to transform these systems often antiquated in many respects into modern financing systems that facilitate access to domestic markets mobilize local savings and reinforce local government autonomy There is no single answer to this question in regard to such a variety of institutional and economic contexts The main objective of the study is to clarify the debates and to enlighten the choices of African decision makers at local and national level <u>Urban Risk Assessments</u> Thierry Paulais, 2012-06-22 This book presents a framework the Urban Risk Assessment for assessing disaster and climate risk in cities which is intended to assist in decision making urban planning and designing risk management programs The approach seeks to strengthen coherence and consensus within and across cities in understanding and planning for risk from natural disasters and climate change The target audience for this book includes policy makers urban practitioners and technical staff and international organizations The Urban Risk Assessment is a flexible approach based on three reinforcing pillars that collectively contribute to the understanding of urban risk a hazard impact assessment an institutional assessment and a socioeconomic assessment The URA is designed to allow flexibility in how it is applied dependent on available financial resources available data relating to hazards and its population and institutional capacity of a given city Based on the identified needs and priorities city governments can select the most appropriate level of risk assessment Chapters 1 and 2 of the book are aimed at policy makers with information on why and how to invest in measures that strengthen the understanding of urban risk Chapter 1 provides background information on the growing importance of disaster and climate risk management strategies at the city level and Chapter 2 provides guidance on how to operationalize and mainstream the Urban Risk Assessment with ongoing urban management and development activities Chapters 3 and 4 are aimed at practitioners and provide details on the conceptual approach components uses and monitoring requirements for carrying out an Urban Risk Assessment **Housing Market Dynamics in Africa** El-hadj M.

Yazbeck, 2015-10-22 Africa is poised on the edge of a potential takeoff to sustained economic growth This takeoff can be abetted by a demographic dividend from the changes in population age structure Declines in child mortality followed by declines in fertility produce a bulge generation and a large number of working age people giving a boost to the economy In the short run lower fertility leads to lower youth dependency rates and greater female labor force participation outside the home Smaller family sizes also mean more resources to invest in the health and education per child boosting worker productivity In the long run increased life spans from health improvements mean that this large high earning cohort will also want to save for retirement creating higher savings and investments leading to further productivity gains Two things are required for the demographic dividend to generate an African economic takeoff The first is to speed up the fertility decline that is currently slow or stalled in many countries The second is economic policies that take advantage of the opportunity offered by demography While demographic change can produce more and high quality workers this potential workforce needs to be productively employed if Africa is to reap the dividend However once underway the relationship between demographic change and human development works in both directions creating a virtuous cycle that can accelerate fertility decline social development and economic growth Empirical evidence points to three key factors for speeding the fertility transition child health female education and women s empowerment particularly through access to family planning Harnessing the dividend requires job creation for the large youth cohorts entering working age and encouraging foreign investment until domestic savings and investment increase The appropriate mix of policies in each country depends on their stage of the demographic transition **Urban Labor Markets** in Sub-Saharan Africa Philippe De Vreyer, Francois Roubaud, 2013-06-07 Although labor is usually the unique asset upon which poor people can make a living little is known about the functioning of labor markets in Sub Saharan Africa The purpose of this volume is to contribute to the building of knowledge in this area In this book the authors use a unique set of identical and simultaneous labor force surveys conducted in seven capitals of Western Africa as well as in some other African countries Cameroon Madagascar Democratic Republic of Congo in the 2000s They present innovative and original results on how people are faring in these labour markets using up to date econometric and statistical methods Because so little is known about labor markets in the region each chapter starts with detailed descriptive statistics that aim to shed light onto specific aspects of African urban labor markets Comparisons between the ten cities are systematically carried out Descriptive sections are followed by in depth analyses on various issues The book is divided into four parts that examine 13 topics Part I presents the main stylised facts which are investigated further in a more analytical way throughout the volume Part II focuses on job quality and labor market conditions such as unemployment and underemployment vulnerability and job

sector to reach the globalnutrition targets for stunting anemia and breastfeeding and interventions for treatingwasting However the determinants of undernutrition are multisectoral and the solution toundernutrition requires multisectoral approaches An acceleration of the progress to reducestunting in Sub Saharan Africa requires engaging additional sectors such as agriculture education social protection and water sanitation and hygiene WASH to improve nutrition This book lays the groundwork for more effective multisectoral action by analyzing andgenerating empirical evidence to inform the joint targeting of nutrition sensitive interventions Using information from 33 recent Demographic and Health Surveys DHS measures are constructed to capture a child s access to food security care practices health care and WASH to identify gaps in access among different socioeconomic groups and to relate access to thesenutrition drivers to nutrition outcomes All Hands on Deck Reducing Stunting through Multisectoral Efforts in Sub Saharan Africanddresses three main questions Do children have inadequate access to the underlying determinants of nutrition What is the association between stunting and inadequate food care practices health and WASH access Can the sectors that have the greatest impact on stunting be identified This book provides country authorities with a holistic picture of the gaps in access to the drivers of nutrition within countries to assist them in the formulation of a more informed evidence based and balanced multisectoral strategy against undernutrition
