DIRECTIONS: "I want you to make a picture of a person. Make the very best picture that you can. Take your time and work very carefully. Try very hard and see what a good picture you can make."

| TIME: | No time limit. Usually 10 minutes will suffice with young children. This test is to be used primarily as a screening device. The drawings of bright children more than 10 years old or those who have had drawing lessons will result in an invalid evaluation of the child's intellectual potential. SCORING |

| CLASSA | Preliminary Stage in which the drawing cannot be recognized as a human figure. 1. Aimless uncontrolled scribbling – score 0. |
| CLASSB | Lines somewhat controlled – approaches crude geometrical form – score 1. All drawings that can be recognized as attempts to represent the human figure. Each point is scored plus or minus. One credit for each point scored plus and no half-credits given. |
| GROSS DETAIL | 1. Head present |
| | 2. Legs present |
| | 3. Arms present |
| | 4. Trunk prepent |
| | 5. Length of trank greater than breadth. |
| | Shoulders are indicated (abrupt broadening of trunk below neck) |
