undergraduate courses dealing with fund raising as a primary or secondary subject Among its features each chapter points out research gaps and opportunities such as problems and theories for master s theses and doctoral dissertations and ends with a list of suggested readings The text is appropriate for the diverse academic areas in which fund raising nonprofit management and philanthropy are taught including public administration management arts and humanities education social work economics and sociology Because of its public relations orientation it is particularly suited for courses offered in that discipline Additional audiences are practitioners enrolled in professional development programs CEOs trustees and others interested in self study and scholars who need serious literature on the subject
