Managing Challenging Behaviour

Tantrums / Excessive Anger

Shouting, Screaming, Crying, Throwing themselves

Breaking Things / Disrespectful

Throwing / kicking objects, breaking toys

Hurting Others

Biting, Hitting, Kicking, Nipping

Defiance

Refusing to follow requests, rules or instructions

Fussiness

Refusing to eat certain foods or take part in certain activities

Possible Reasons for Behaviour

Modelled - Child copying learned behaviours

Overstimulation - Child needs stimulation

Seeking - Child is looking for attention

- Child is finding something difficult

Overwhelmed - Child feels overwhelmed by

too much going on

Child may be expressing strong emotions

Testing Boundaries - Child is exploring what happens if...

Feeling Unwell / Tired or Hungry

Change in Routine / Family Circumstances



Prevention & Intervention Strategies

Understand - Notice and understand what situations trigger the behaviours and adapt, avoid or help child find better coping strategies

Ignore - Good for minor attention-seeking behaviours. Ignore the behaviour and only reward the child with attention once they have stopped the behaviour.

Distract - Stop the negative behaviour or prevent a situation from escalating by providing an appealing alternative.

Encourage Empathy - Point out how the negative behaviour makes another person feel (e.g. sad, hurt) Ask child how they would feel if someone did the same to them.

Be Clear & Consistent - Ensure child is aware of what you want them to do. Be consistent in what you say and how negative behaviour is dealt with.

Promoting Positive Behaviour

Reinforce the Positive - Give praise and attention to good behaviour. e.g. thank child for being helpful, give attention when they are kind to others

Be a good Role Model - Demonstrate positive behaviours, favourable attitudes and desirable ways to interact with others. Children learn by copying behaviours!

Support Emotional Wellbeing - Through routines and activities help children learn about feelings and emotions, why we have them and how we can share and manage them.

Use Rewards - Allow child choose next toy, activity because 'they have been kind and helpful' OR Use stickers or certificates to help visually reinforce good behaviour.
