Dead Funny Rudolph Herzog,2011 The first ever history of humour directed at the Nazis from the anti Nazi theatre scene of the 20s and 30s to jokes told during WWII to the cracks told about Hitler in Germany today In the light of the horrors he committed many people in Germany still find difficulty and distaste in laughing at Hitler indeed those who do are often accused of trivialising the Holocaust But there is a long history of telling jokes about the Nazis Collected by acclaimed director Rudolph Herzog *Dead Funny* chronicles this fascinating and often frightening history **Dead Funny** Rudolph Herzog,2011-04-26 In Nazi Germany telling jokes about Hitler could get you killed Hitler and G ring are standing on top of the Berlin radio tower Hitler says he wants to do something to put a smile on the Berliners faces G ring says Why don t you jump When a woman told this joke in Germany in 1943 she was arrested by the Nazis and sentenced to death by guillotine it didn t matter that her husband was a good German soldier who died in battle In this groundbreaking work of history Rudolph Herzog takes up such stories to show how widespread humor was during the Third Reich It s a fascinating and frightening history from the suppression of the anti Nazi cabaret scene of the 1930s to jokes made at the expense of the Nazis during WWII to the collections of whispered jokes that were published in the immediate aftermath of the war Herzog argues that jokes provide a hitherto missing chapter of WWII history The jokes show that not all Germans were hypnotized by Nazi propaganda and in taking on subjects like Nazi concentration camps they record a public acutely aware of the horrors of the regime Thus *Dead Funny* is a tale of terrible silence and cowardice but also of occasional and inspiring bravery **Guilty Pleasures** Laura E. Lexicon of the Mouth Brandon LaBelle, 2014-06-19 While the eyes may lead to the soul the mouth exposes the vitality of the body Examining the movements of the mouth or what LaBelle terms micro oralities Lexicon of the Mouth considers the relation of voice and mouth suggesting that the importance of voicing is inextricably bound to the exertions of the oral Laughter whispering singing burping and self talk among many others feature as choreographies by which to gauge the exchange of self and surrounding LaBelle argues for a more attentive view onto voice by expanding appreciation for how whistling links us to animals coughing ruptures all possibility for speech and the inner voice or unvoice operates as a shadow body Subsequently assumptions around voice are unsettled reminding discourses surrounding the performativity of the body and the politics of speech of the acts of the tongue the lips and the glottis as primary negotiations between interior and exterior

Graphic Satire in the Soviet Union John Etty, 2018-12-18 After the death of Joseph Stalin Soviet era Russia experienced a flourishing artistic movement due to relaxed censorship and new economic growth In this new atmosphere of freedom Russia's satirical magazine Krokodil The Crocodile became rejuvenated John Etty explores Soviet graphic satire through Krokodil and its political cartoons He investigates the forms production consumption and functions of Krokodil focusing on the period from 1954 to 1964 Krokodil remained the longest serving and most important satirical journal in the Soviet Union unique in producing state sanctioned graphic satirical comment on Soviet and international affairs for over seventy years Etty's analysis of Krokodil extends and enhances our understanding of Soviet graphic satire beyond state sponsored propaganda For most of its life Krokodil consisted of a sixteen page satirical magazine comprising a range of cartoons photographs and verbal texts Authored by professional and nonprofessional contributors and published by Pravda in Moscow it produced state sanctioned satirical comment on Soviet and international affairs from 1922 onward Soviet citizens and scholars of the USSR recognized Krokodil as the most significant influential source of Soviet graphic satire Indeed the magazine enjoyed an international reputation and many Americans and Western Europeans regardless of political affiliation found the images pointed and witty Astoundingly the magazine outlived the USSR but until now has received little scholarly attention

Spring Man Petr Janecek,2022-10-31 Spring Man A Belief Legend between Folklore and Popular Culture deconstructs the nationalistic myth of Spring Man that was created after the Second World War in visual culture and literature and presents his original form as an ambiguous ghostly denizen of oral culture Petr Janecek analyzes the archetypal character social context and cultural significance of this fascinating phenomenon with the help of dozens of accounts provided by period eyewitnesses oral narratives and other sources At the same time the author illustrates the international origin of the tales in the originally British migratory legend of Spring heeled Jack that reaches back to the second third of the nineteenth century and Janecek also draws parallels between the Czech myth of Spring Man and similar urban phantom narratives popular in the 1910s Russia 1940s United States and Slovakia and 1950s Germany as well as other parts of the world

Representation and Memory in Graphic Novels Golnar Nabizadeh,2019-04-16 This book analyses the relationship between comics and cultural memory By focussing on a range of landmark comics from the twentieth and twenty first centuries the discussion draws attention to the ongoing role of visual culture in framing testimony particularly in relation to underprivileged subjects such as migrants and refugees individuals dealing with war and oppressive regimes and individuals living with particular health conditions The discussion is influenced by literary and cultural debates on the intersections between ethics testimony trauma and human rights reflected in its three overarching questions How do comics usually complicate the production of cultural memory in local contents and global mediascapes How do comics engage with and generate new forms of testimonial address and How do the comics function as mnemonic structures The author highlights that the power of comics is that they allow both creators and readers to visualise the fracturing power of violence and oppression at the level of the individual domestic communal national and international in powerful and creative ways Comics do not stand outside of literature cinema or any of the other arts but rather enliven the reciprocal relationship between the verbal and the visual language that informs all of these media As such the discussion demonstrates how fields such as graphic medicine graphic justice and comics journalism contribute to existing theoretical and analytics debates including critical visual theory trauma and memory studies by offering a broad ranging yet cohesive analysis of cultural memory and its representation in print and digital comics

Silent History Peter K.
