1873 the redrafting of the Governor General's instructions which was done between 1875 and 1877 and centralization of the penitentiary system completed by 1875. The Department benefited from a deeply rooted expectation that law was both apolitical and necessary. This ideology functioned in a variety of ways: it gave the Department considerable latitude for setting policy and solving problems but rationalized the appearance of politicized legal decisions. It also legitimized Department officials' claim that it was especially suited to review all legislation, advise on the royal prerogative of mercy, administer national penitentiaries and appoint judges to the bench. Ultimately the fictional notion of law as apolitical and necessary placed the Department of Justice squarely in the midst of the completion of Confederation.
