cultural artifact fashioned from a distinct way of seeing Drawing on science and technology studies she situates letter writing artifact collecting and photography as important expeditionary practices that helped shape the way we understand Machu Picchu today Cox Hall also demonstrates that the photographic evidence was unstable and as images circulated worldwide the lost city took on different meanings especially in Peru which came to view the site as one of national patrimony in need of protection from expeditions such as Bingham's
