this context Recent advances in neurosciences have allowed us to take a new neurobiological look on the similarities and dissimilarities of cognitive capacities and their neural basis across both closely and distantly related species A couple of decades ago the comparisons were mainly drawn between human and non human primates investigating the cytoarchitecture of particular brain areas and their structural connectivity Moreover comparative studies were conducted with respect to their ability to process grammars of different complexity So far the available data suggest that non human primates are able to learn simple probabilistic grammars but not hierarchically structured complex grammars.
