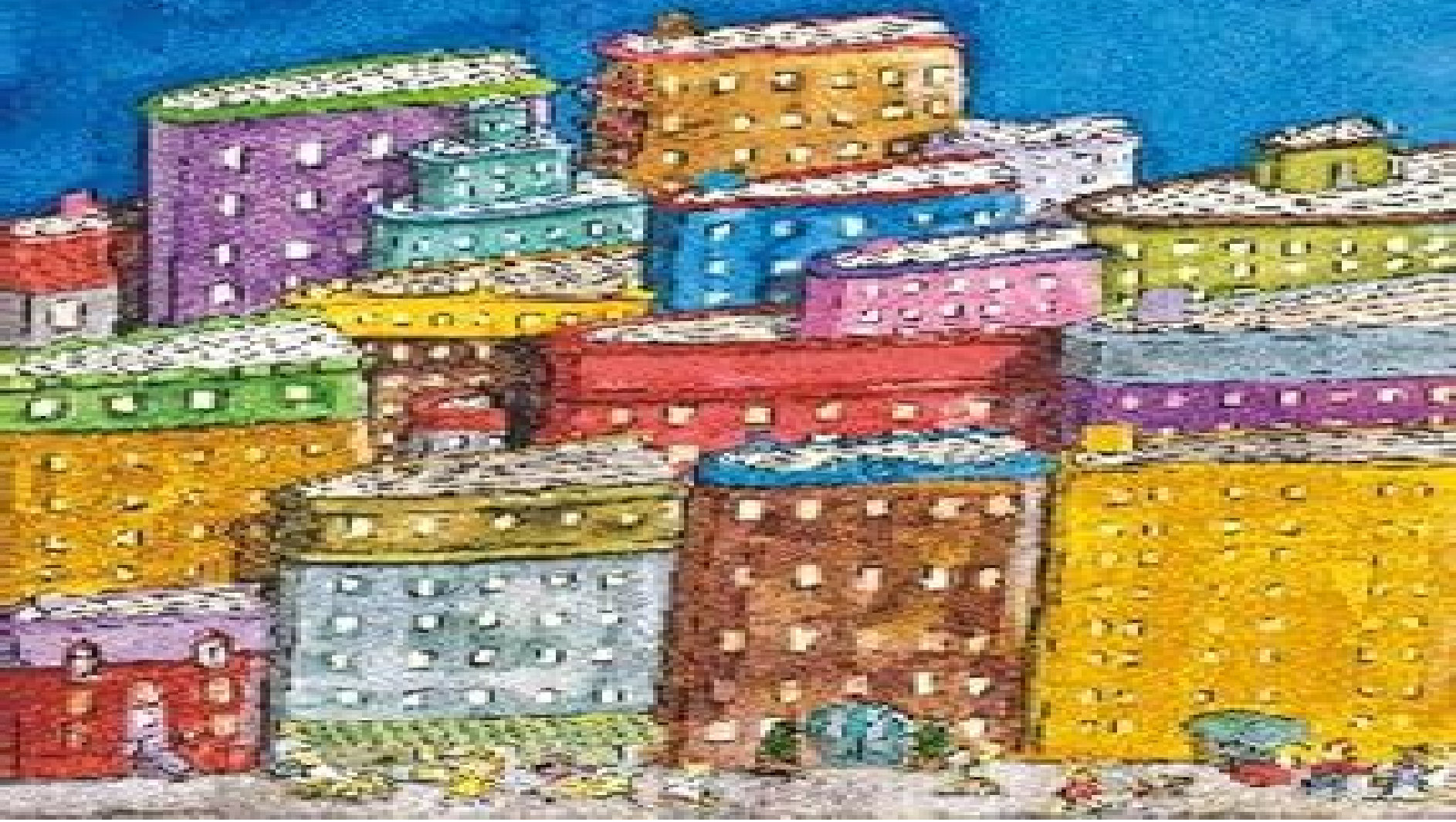

Cities, Cultures, Conversations Richard Marback, Patrick Bruch, Jill Eicher, 1998 Often the urban experience and its issues are out of reach for the non urbanite This book helps bring that experience closer to new writers by developing the experience as a context for writing and connecting it to real life experiences of the writer Over 52 readings focus on various urban issue and realities such as neighborhood and community crime art city life what happened in LA style and more Writers who want to expand their writing skills to more controversial urban issues *Cities of Pleasure* Alan Collins, 2013-09-13 This book contains a collection of cutting edge chapters that explore various connections between urban living sexuality and sexual desire around the world The key themes featured address a number of topical issues including the controversies and debates raging around the evolution defining patterns and appropriate regulation of commercial sex zones and markets in the urban landscape how gay public spaces districts and gay villages emerged and developed in various towns and cities around the world how changing attitudes to and the usage of urban sexual spaces as depicted in iconic television series such as Sex and the City and Queer as Folk reflect the reality of working women s or gay men s changing life experiences With detailed case studies and a strong interdisciplinary appeal this book will be a valuable reference for postgraduates and advanced students in the fields of cultural studies as well as human urban and social geography This book was previously published as a special issue of the journal Urban Studies **Dialogue and Rhetoric** Edda Weigand, 2008 The volume deals with the relationship between dialogue and rhetoric The actual state of the art in dialogue analysis is characterized by a tendency to overcome the distinction between competence and performance and to combine components from both sides of the dichotomy in a way which includes rules as well as inferences The same is true of rhetoric the guidelines proposed here no longer state that rationality and persuasion are mutually exclusive but suggest that they interact in what might be called the mixed game The concept of a dialogic rhetoric thus poses the question of how to integrate the different voices Part I of the volume assembles several rhetorical paradigms which are applied to real life performance Part II on rhetoric in the mixed game contains a selection of papers which illustrate the interaction of various components The Round Table discussion in Part III brings proponents of different paradigms face to face with each other and shows how they justify their own positions and present arguments against rival paradigms *The affective city* Stefano Catucci, Federico De Matteis, 2022-01-21 Cities are not made only of stone they harbor ways of life practices movements moods atmospheres feelings Yet the ineffable nature of affects has long deprived human passions of a meaningful role when it comes to observing urban space and envisioning its future transformation With this book we explore the contemporary city and its transitional conditions from a different perspective a quest to understand how the space of collective life and the feelings this engenders are connected how they mutually give form to each other In an interdisciplinary collection of essays The Affective City means to open a discussion on the soft presences animating the world of urban objects beyond the city built out of mere things this

book's focus is on the forces that make urban life emerge thrive flourish but also wither and sometimes die A task crucial for the survival of cities as human habitats in an urban world that with every passing day seems to draw closer a crisis

Brand-Driven City Building and the Virtualizing of Space Alexander Gutzmer, 2014-04-24 This book is an investigation of the cultural phenomenon of branding and its transformational effects on the contemporary spatial and urban reality It develops a novel understanding of the rationale behind the construction of large scale architectural complexes that relate to corporate brands and of its tremendous cultural effects The author suggests that what we see today is the creation of global mass ornaments of a thorough ornamentalization of the entire globe The origins of this are discussed with regard to examples of corporate brand building from Europe and China Autostadt Wolfsburg BMW Welt Munich and Anting New Town Additional cases are several simulated spaces in Berlin and the space branding activities of companies like Apple or Prada Theoretically the author develops an innovative poststructuralist framework combining ideas from Gilles Deleuze with the space philosophy of Peter Sloterdijk He analyzes how the corporate redefinition of space makes the city enter into a mode of virtual urbanity This idea leads to a notion of a global urban and ultimately the global mass ornament This concept of a global mass ornament is developed here with reference to Sloterdijk's concept of a world of spheres The latter is used to understand the new mode of spatiality of mediatized spaces The book makes the point that our world is involved in a process of mass ornamentalization that has only just begun The concept of the global mass ornament is the first to come to grips with a culture in which branding is effectively changing the physiognomy of the earth The global mass ornament is a banner for a cultural transformation that employs architecture sign theory and mechanisms borrowed from traditional advertising and from social media as well as social processes and that we have yet to properly understand This book is a significant step forward in this respect

Atmospheres: Aesthetics of Emotional Spaces Tonino Griffero, 2016-04-08 Originally published in Italian in 2010 this book is the first to address the theory of atmospheres in a thorough and systematic way It examines the role of atmospheres in daily life and defines their main characteristics Outlining the typical phenomenological situations in which we experience atmospheres it assesses their impact on contemporary aesthetics It puts forward a philosophical approach which systematises a constellation of affects and climates finds patterns in the emotional tones of different spaces affordances and assesses their impact on the felt body It also critically discusses the spatial turn invoked by several of the social sciences and argues that there is a need for a non psychologistic rethinking of the philosophy of emotions It provides a history of the term atmosphere and of the concepts anticipating its meaning *genius loci* *aura* *Stimmung* *numinous* emotional design and *ambiance* and examines the main ontological characteristics of atmospheres and their principal phenomenological characteristics It concludes by showing how atmospheres affect our emotions our bodies reactions our state of mind and as a result our behaviour and judgments Griffero assesses how atmospheres are more effective than we have been rationally willing to admit and to what extent traditional aesthetics unilaterally oriented towards art has underestimated this truth
