an environment by studying independently searching for resources and finding multimodal ways of learning It is also important to note that naturally human beings are curious and want to learn in order to conquer their world Hence Piaget s work of intellectual autonomy cannot be ignored when exploring metacognition If learning experiences were ideal and developmental they would be no need to nurture metacognition Unfortunately the education systems remove students curiosity by bringing fake environments into learning that impede creation and imagination This book emphasises the power of metacognition at different levels of learning It can be seen as a parallel intervention approach with expanded knowledge on how to extend existing skills for young children which is a pre intervention Authors in this book bring diverse viewpoints from diverse fields on how to nurture metacognition thus giving the reader an opportunity to borrow strategies from other fields This contribution is a mixture of empirical contributions and opinion pieces informed by review of literature
