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Critical Care Nursing of Older Adults: Best Practices (3rd ed.) includes major clinical issues for nursing professionals working with older patients at critical care settings, including critical care and step-down units to those in trauma and emergency departments. As the number of elderly with multiple comorbid conditions has grown significantly, older adults represent the major clients receiving critical nursing care. The physiologic and psychosocial changes that accompany aging and the interaction among the nature of episodic care delivery at critical care settings provided create unique challenges for caring for older adults with critical and intensive care needs. This book provides a comprehensive best-practice and theoretical guide in elderly care for clinicians, educators, and graduate students at various levels.

The book includes 26 chapters that are grouped in four parts. Part I (chapters 1-4) provides the background and context of critical care in older adults. Chapters 2 to 4 describe current standards of practice and key areas of patient safety and quality initiatives for geriatric nursing and how they interface with critically ill conditions. These chapters also provide resources to guide best practices. Chapter 3 addresses the nature of the critical care environment. It provides strategies to modify the environment to promote and preserve functional ability in older adults and lead to an optimal healing setting.

Part II (chapters 5-11) addresses the issues and needs of older adults from social aspects pertinent to critical care nursing on the following topics: ethical decision-making, continuity of care, family responses to critical care of the older adult, end-of-life care, becoming frail,
