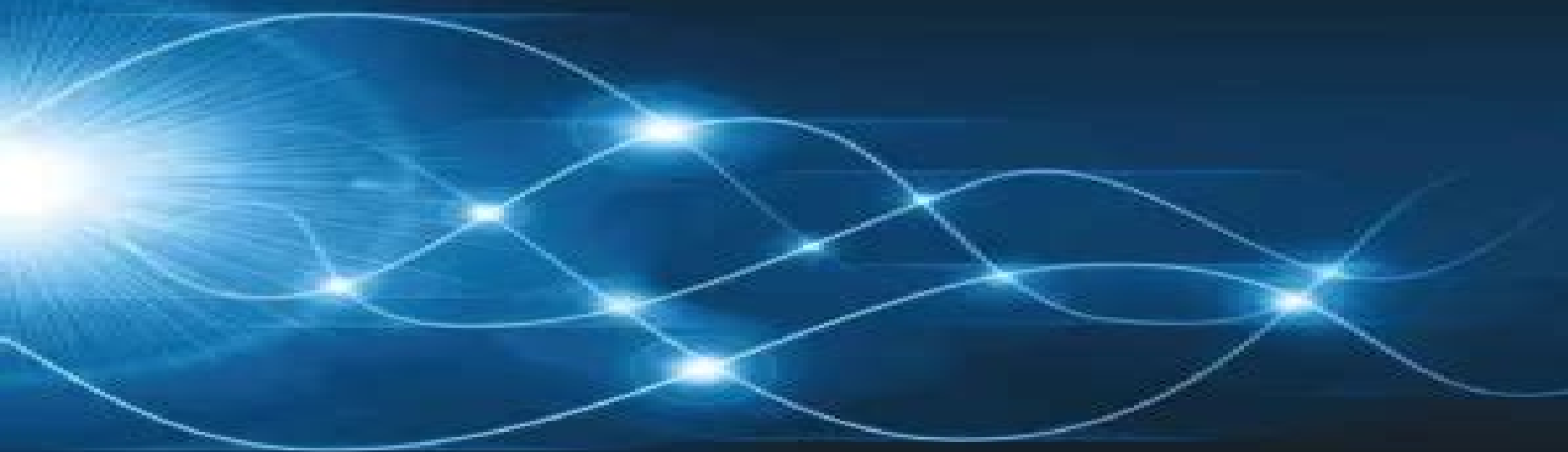

all three toyed with a Northeast style capitalist developmental state approach to growth because governments in IMT lacked the political requisites to make this strategy work none really stuck to this approach to growth either Instead dictators and democrats in IMT implemented highly pragmatic growth and development strategies When markets worked governments used them When interventions worked governments relied on them When either failed to deliver expected results governments weeded out bad investments to sustain high growth Such a pragmatic trial and error approach to development should also be of keen interest to the Rest
