Functional Family Therapy (FFT)

Het behandelprogramma FFT (Functional Family Therapy) wordt gekenmerkt door een systeemgerichte aanpak. De oplossing voor het probleemgedrag van de jongere ligt volgens FFT in het verbeteren van de relaties tussen de gezinsleden. Door een positieve en persoonlijke benadering van alle gezinsleden zoekt de therapeut, samen met de gezinsleden, naar een manier waarop uiteindelijk iedereen medeverantwoordelijk kan worden voor de ontstane situatie.

■ Doelgroep

De behandeling richt zich op gezinnen waarvan een kind zeer problematisch gedrag vertoont. De behandeling is gericht op jongeren in de leeftijd van 12 tot 18 jaar. Er is een uitloop mogelijk naar 23 jaar, mits de desbetreffende jongere opgroeit binnen zijn gezin.

Doelstelling

FFT richt zich op het verbeteren van gezinsrelaties en onderlinge communicatie waardoor het probleemgedrag van de jongere vermindert.

Het effect van FFT

internationaal wetenschappelijk onderzoek heeft aangetoond dat door FFT bij 80% van de jongeren het probleemgedrag vermindert. Daarnaast verbetert het functioneren van de gezinnen van deze jongeren en het aantal uithuisplaatsingen neemt af

■ Het team

Om de kwaliteit van de behandeling te waarborgen wordt deze uitgevoerd door speciaal opgeleide therapeuten. Zij ontvangen wekelijks supervisie. Er is ook een psychiater verbonden aan het FFT behandelprogramma.

Werkwijze

De FFT-behandeling bestaat uit drie fasen:

1. Verbindings- en motiveringsfase

Die therapeut helpt de gezinsleden het probleemigedrag van de jongere te begrijpen. Hoe komt het? Waar komt het vandaan? Samen met het gezin wordt besproken hoe het patroon doorbroken kan worden.

2.Gedragsveranderingsfase

De gezinsleden leren diverse vaardigheden die ze toe kunnen passen om de situatie te verbeteren.

3. Generalisatiefase

De therapeut maakt samen met het gezin een plan voor na de behandeling. Het doel van het plan is dat de dingen die goed gaan behouden kunnen blijven. Ook bevat het vervolgstappen en handvaten voor de momenten waarop het moeizaam gaat. De therapeut denkt indien nodig, mee over een doorverwijzing of vervolgbehandeling.
