Rationale

The Hero's Journey, as experienced through a study of myths and legends, enables students to be exposed to particular cultural knowledge, recognise the functioning of narrative, and to explore the forms and structures of narrative. In this unit students specifically learn to recognise the character traits of the archetypes of the hero's journey, recognise the different types of heroes, and recognise the pattern of the hero's journey or quest that is the basis of narrative. Students also learn about:

- how narrative and metaphor are used to make sense of our world
- the cultural significance of myths and legends and the morals and values they present
- the basis of the hero's journey in myths and legends in literature and film.
