Creative Writing Guide

It is important to plan your story before you begin writing. Follow this guide to help you to write a well-structured story with interesting language.

Engaging opening

Grab your reader's attention with something interesting, unusual or dramatic. Try using onomatopoeia, a question, direct speech or a character looking back on events.

Setting

Create strong imagery with adjectives, adverbs and descriptive language techniques such as similes, metaphors, personification, alliteration, repetition, triples, onomatopoeia and pathetic fallacy. Describe the weather, landscape, buildings, creatures, plants and trees.

Characters

Make them interesting, include details such as the way they walk and talk, their size, facial expressions/features and their personality.

Time ordered events

Begin at one time and then move to the next. For example: afternoon, evening, morning or summer, autumn, winter.

Advanced: try using foreshadowing, motifs and a nonlinear structure using flashbacks and time shifts.

Strong ending

Make it memorable and satisfying for the reader. Link your ending to the beginning of the story.
