 grades will participate in the Annual Egg Drop Contest on to celebrate the beginning of spring. Students in each grade can submit an egg-traption that they think will withstand a drop from a ladder. Teams of one to three members can work together to submit their projects. Be creative and use what you know about matter, motion and force to create your project!

Egg Drop Rules

Originality and creativity are appreciated, but your design needs to follow these guidelines:

1. Design **cannot** involve liquids, helium, other lighter-than-air gases, or glass; (remember, containers are used at your own risk and will not be replaced – don't use them without asking your parents!)
2. Weight cannot exceed one pound. (all containers will be measured and weighed first to ensure they meet these requirements)
3. Container cannot exceed one foot in any direction. (Once deployed a parachute or other such device may extend beyond one foot. See Rule #5)
4. You must bring your egg already in the container or place your egg into your container just prior to your drop.
5. Use of parachutes is allowed, but the chute must deploy itself after the container is dropped.
6. You must be able to remove your egg and show it to the teacher in its original raw state after the drop to win the event.

Your Egg-citing Challenge

The goal of this challenge is to have a raw chicken egg fall approximately six to eight feet onto a hard surface and survive the impact uncracked. Let's look at the elements of the problem.

- **Eggshells are remarkably strong.** If you hold an egg in the palm of your hand and try to crush it by wrapping your fingers around it and squeezing, you will find that it takes a large force to crack the shell. However, the shell can be broken rather easily by hitting a small area with a hard object. Therefore, you need to protect your egg from very large forces applied all over and from moderate forces applied to small areas of contact.
