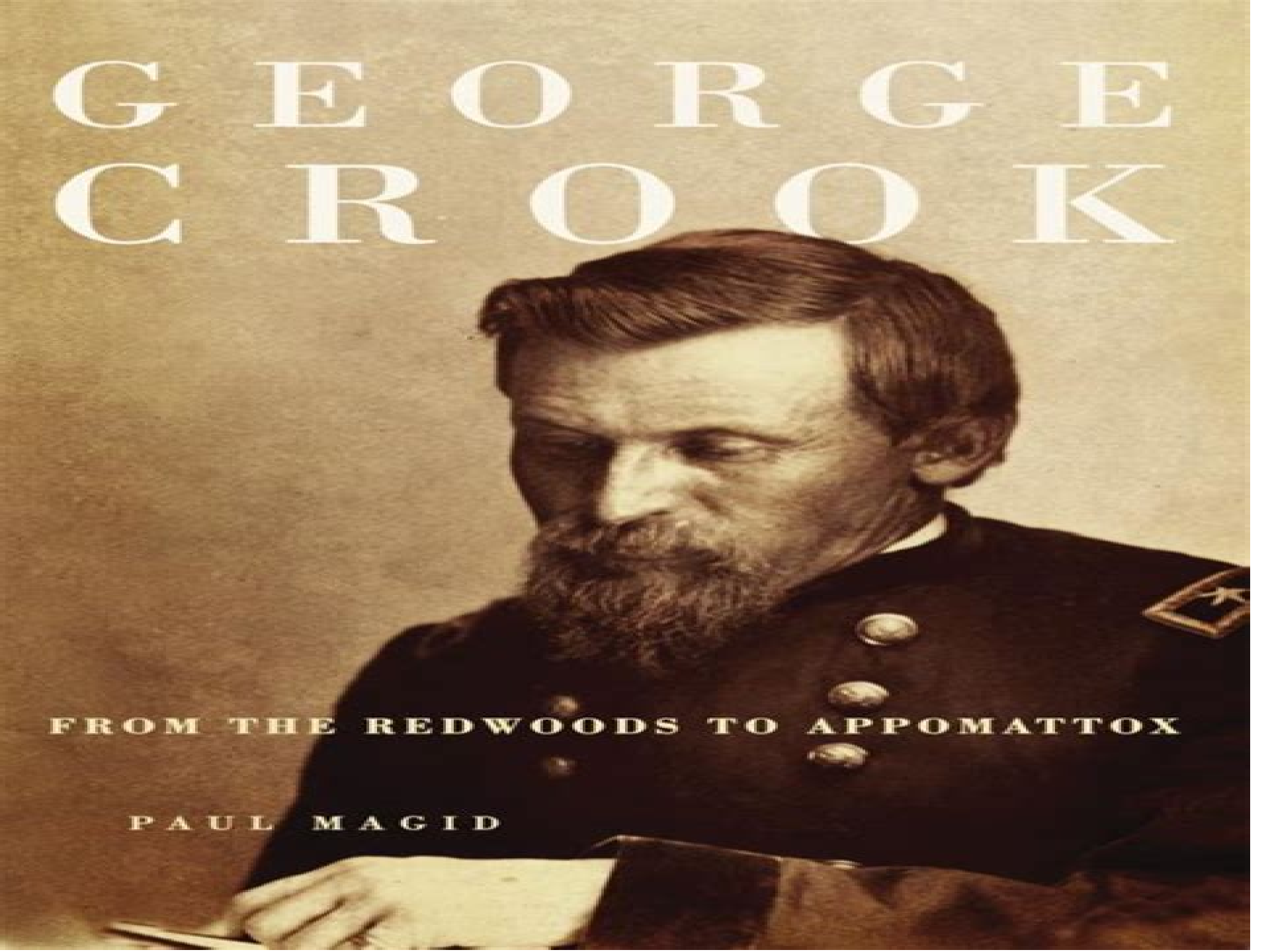

George Crook From The Redwoods To Appomattox:

George Crook Paul Magid, 2013-07-17 Renowned for his prominent role in the Apache and Sioux wars General George Crook 1828-90 was considered by William Tecumseh Sherman to be his greatest Indian fighting general Although Crook was feared by Indian opponents on the battlefield in defeat the tribes found him a true friend and advocate who earned their trust and friendship when he spoke out in their defense against political corruption and greed Paul Magid's detailed and engaging narrative focuses on Crook's early years through the end of the Civil War Magid begins with Crook's boyhood on the Ohio frontier and his education at West Point then recounts his nine years military service in California during the height of the Gold Rush It was in the Far West that Crook acquired the experience and skills essential to his success as an Indian fighter This is primarily an account of Crook's dramatic and sometimes controversial role in the Civil War in which he was involved on three fronts in West Virginia Tennessee and Virginia Crook saw action during the battle of Antietam and played important roles in two major offensives in the Shenandoah Valley and in the Chattanooga and Appomattox campaigns His courage leadership and tactical skills won him the respect and admiration of his commanding officers including Generals Grant and Sheridan He soon rose to the rank of major general and received four brevet promotions for bravery and meritorious service Along the way he led both infantry and cavalry pioneered innovations in guerrilla warfare conducted raids deep into enemy territory and endured a kidnapping by Confederate partisans *George Crook* offers insight into the influences that later would make this general both a nemesis of the Indian tribes and their ardent advocate and it illuminates the personality of this most enigmatic and eccentric of army officers [The Gray Fox](#) Paul Magid, 2015-04-23

George Crook was one of the most prominent military figures of the late nineteenth century Indian Wars Yet today his name is largely unrecognized despite the important role he played in such pivotal events in western history as the Custer fight at the Little Big Horn the death of Crazy Horse and the Geronimo campaigns As Paul Magid portrays Crook in this highly readable second volume of a projected three volume biography the general was an innovative and eccentric soldier with a complex and often contradictory personality whose activities often generated intense controversy Though known for his uncompromising ferocity in battle he nevertheless respected his enemies and grew to know and feel compassion for them Describing campaigns against the Paiutes Apaches Sioux and Cheyennes Magid's vivid narrative explores Crook's abilities as an Indian fighter The Apaches among the fiercest peoples in the West called Crook the Gray Fox after an animal viewed in their culture as a herald of impending death Generals Grant and Sherman both regarded him as indispensable to their efforts to subjugate the western tribes Though noted for his aggressiveness in combat Crook was a reticent officer who rarely raised his voice habitually dressed in shabby civilian attire and often rode a mule in the field He was also self-confident to the point of arrogance harbored fierce grudges and because he marched to his own beat got along poorly with his superiors He had many enduring friendships both in and outside the army though he divulged little of his inner self to others and some of his closest comrades

knew he could be cold and insensitive As Magid relates these crucial episodes of Crook s life a dominant contradiction emerges while he was an unforgiving warrior in the field he not infrequently risked his career to do battle with his military superiors and with politicians in Washington to obtain fair treatment for the very people against whom he fought Upon hearing of the general s death in 1890 Chief Red Cloud spoke for his Sioux people He at least never lied to us His words gave the people hope

Utley, 2018-02-01 Taking a novel approach to the military history of the post Civil War West distinguished historian Robert M Utley examines the careers of seven military leaders who served as major generals for the Union in the Civil War then as brigadier generals in command of the U S Army s western departments By examining both periods in their careers Utley makes a unique contribution in delineating these commanders strengths and weaknesses While some of the book s subjects notably Generals George Crook and Nelson A Miles are well known most are no longer widely remembered Yet their actions were critical in the expansion of federal control in the West The commanders effected the final subjugation of American Indian tribal groups exercising direct oversight of troops in the field as they fought the wars that would bring Indians under military and government control After introducing readers to postwar army doctrine organization and administration Utley takes each general in turn describing his background personality eccentricities and command style and presenting the rudiments of the campaigns he prosecuted Crook embodied the ideal field general personally leading his troops in their operations though with varying success Christopher C Augur and John Pope in contrast preferred to command from their desks in department headquarters an approach that led both of them to victory on the battlefield And Miles while perhaps the frontier army s most detestable officer was also its most successful in the field Rounding out the book with an objective comparison of all eight generals

performance records Utley offers keen insights into their influence on the U S military as an institution and on the development of the American West

Hedren, 2019-04-11 The Battle of the Rosebud may well be the largest Indian battle ever fought in the American West The monumental clash on June 17 1876 along Rosebud Creek in southeastern Montana pitted George Crook and his Shoshone and Crow allies against Sioux and Northern Cheyennes under Sitting Bull and Crazy Horse It set the stage for the battle that

Scouting with the Buffalo Soldiers John P. Langellier,2020-10-15 On a hot summer s day in Montana a daring frontier cavalry officer Powhatan Henry Clarke died at the height of his promising career A member of the U S Military Academy s Class of 1884 Clarke graduated dead last and while short on academic application he was long on charm and bravado Clarke obtained a commission with the black troops of the Tenth Cavalry earning his spurs with these Buffalo Soldiers He evolved into a fearless field commander at the troop level gaining glory and first hand knowledge of what it took to campaign in the West During his brief action packed career Clarke saved a black trooper s life while under Apache fire and was awarded the Medal of Honor A chance meeting brought Clarke together with artist Frederic Remington who brought national attention to Clarke when he illustrated the exploit for an 1886 Harper s Weekly The officer and artist became friends and Clarke served as a model and consultant for future artwork by Remington Remington s many depictions of Clarke added greatly to the

cavalryman's luster. In turn, the artist gained fame and fortune in part from drawing on Clarke as his muse. The story of these two unlikely comrades tells much about the final stages of the Wild West and the United States' emergence on the international scene. Along the way, Geronimo, the Apache Kid, Texas John Slaughter, and others played their roles in Clarke's brief but compelling drama.

An Honest Enemy Paul Magid, 2020-04-23

Over the course of his military career, George Crook developed empathy and admiration for American Indians, both as foes and as allies. As Paul Magid has demonstrated in the previous two volumes of his groundbreaking biography, this experience prepared Crook well for his metamorphosis from Indian fighter to outspoken advocate of Indian rights. *An Honest Enemy* is the third and final volume of Magid's account of George Crook's life and involvement in the Indian wars. Magid describes Crook's struggle to reconcile these conflicting concerns while promoting policies he regarded as essential to the welfare of the Indians in the face of a hostile public, jealous fellow officers, and an unsympathetic government that regarded his efforts as quixotic and misguided. from no lack of drama interest or importance The ramifications of the May 1864 engagement which involved only 10 000 troops were substantial Previous studies however focused on the Confederate side of the story David Powell s Union Command Failure in the Shenandoah Major General Franz Sigel and the War in the Valley of Virginia May 1864 provides the balance that has so long been needed Union General Ulysses S Grant regarded a spring campaign in the Valley of Virginia as integral to his overall strategy designed to turn Robert E Lee s strategic western flank deny his Army of Northern Virginia much needed supplies and prevent other Confederates from reinforcing Lee It fell to Union general and German transplant Franz Sigel to execute Grant s strategy in the northern reaches of the Shenandoah while Maj Gen George Crook struck elsewhere in southwestern Virginia Sigel s record in the field was checkered at best and he was not Grant s first choice to lead the effort but a combination of politics and other factors left the German in command Sigel met Confederate Maj Gen John C Breckinridge and his small army on May 15 just outside the crossroads town of New Market The hard fought affair hung in the balance until finally the Union lines broke and Sigel s Yankees fled the field Breckinridge s command included some 300 young men from the Virginia Military Institute s Corps of Cadets VMI s presence and dramatic role in the fighting ensured that New Market would never be forgotten but pushed other aspects of this interesting and important campaign into the back seat of history Award winning author David Powell s years of archival and other research provides an outstanding foundation for this outstanding study Previous works have focused on the Confederate side of the battle using Sigel s incompetence as sufficient excuse to explain why the Federals were defeated This methodology however neglects the other important factors that contributed to the ruin of Grant s scheme in the Valley Union Command Failure in the Shenandoah delves into all the issues analyzing the campaign from an operational standpoint Complete with original maps photos and the skillful writing readers have come to expect from the pen of David Powell Union Command Failure in the Shenandoah will satisfy the most demanding students of Civil War history

Longacre is the first balanced detailed and thoroughly scrutinized study of the life and service of the Civil War's most famous cavalryman Long known to scholars and history buffs alike as The Beau Sabreur of the Confederacy James Ewell Brown Stuart of Virginia was possessed of many gifts personally and professionally and led the Army of Northern Virginia's cavalry to the all but complete satisfaction of his superiors Stuart insisted Robert E Lee never brought me a piece of false information Being human Stuart also under performed On occasion he underestimated his opponents took unnecessary risks with his habitually understrength command failed to properly discipline and motivate his troopers and was prone to errors both strategic and tactical These flaws were evident during the Gettysburg Campaign when his wayward route to the battlefield deprived Lee of the ability to safely negotiate his path toward a climactic confrontation with the Union Army of the Potomac Because of his outsized wartime reputation one embellished in the century and a half since most of Stuart's errors have passed virtually unnoticed or when addressed have been excused or explained away in some fashion Longacre's study is based on hundreds of published works archival sources and newspapers He probes not only Stuart's military career but elements of his character and personality that invite investigation Even the man's fiercest partisans admitted that he was vain and inordinately sensitive to criticism with a curious streak of immaturity at times the hard edged veteran at other times a devotee of the pageantry of war given to affectations such as ostrich plumed hats golden spurs and the headquarters musicians who accompanied him on the march Ever motivated by appeals to vanity he curried the patronage of powerful men and responded readily to the attentions of attractive women even though by 1861 he was a long married man Personal flaws and limitations aside Stuart was popular with his officers and men beloved by members of his staff and considered by the people of his state and region the beau ideal of Confederate soldiery The distinction endures today Longacre's J E B Stuart is an attempt to determine its validity Standing Bear's Quest for Freedom Lawrence A.
