The emergence of such colonial territories into independence was generally viewed as a welcome prospect by foreign policy observers in Washington but when combined with the impending victory of communist forces in China it raised the unsettling possibility that the entire region might be brought within the reach of the Kremlin Avoiding Vietnam Conrad C.
