Maybe the idea of owning an exotic pet may be surprising to some people, these situations often cause problems for the owners, when their neighbors complains about these kind of animals, and this represent significant concerns for the animals themselves. Owners, breeders, and sellers of exotic animals need to be aware of which is the applicable federal, state, and local laws. Breeders and sellers who import exotic animals must accomplish with federal legislation, not only relating to importation, but also for keeping adequate living facilities for those kind of animals. Owners are likewise responsible for the conditions where the animals live, as well as the safety of their neighbors and the people surrounding. One of the most typical legal concern arise when an exotic animal injures someone else, that's why the owner needs to look out for the pet in order to keep the security of everyone.

The legal issues relating to the exotic pet trade require balancing the property interests of owners, breeders, and sellers with the government's police power to regulate annoyance and to protect public health and safety. Not only can individuals be injured by exotic animals, but also public health at large can be compromised by diseases brought to a community by non-native species, such as the monkeypox from dogs. The harm that can be done to an ecosystem by releasing non-native animals, in this case referring to exotic
