Friedenthal, 2017-04-03 The superhero Wolverine time travels and changes storylines On Torchwood there s a pill popped to alter memories of the past The narrative technique of retroactive continuity seems rife lately given all the world building in comics Andrew J Friedenthal deems retroactive continuity or retconning as a force with many implications for how Americans view history and culture Friedenthal examines this phenomenon in a range of media from its beginnings in comic books and now its widespread shift into television film and digital media Retconning has reached its present form as a result of the complicated workings of superhero comics In comic books and other narratives retconning often seems utilized to literally rewrite some aspect of a character's past either to keep that character more contemporary to erase stories from continuity that no longer fit or to create future story potential From comics retconning has spread extensively to long form continuity rich dramas on television such as Buffy the Vampire Slayer Lost and beyond Friedenthal explains that in a culture saturated by editable media where interest groups argue over Wikipedia pages and politicians can immediately delete questionable tweets the retcon serves as a perfect metaphor for the ways in which history and our access to information overall has become endlessly malleable In the first book to focus on this subject Friedenthal regards the editable Internet hyperlink rather than the stable printed footnote as the de facto source of information in America today To embrace retroactive continuity in fictional media means accepting that the past itself is not a stable element but rather something constantly in contentious flux Due to retconning s ubiquity within our media we have grown familiar with narratives as inherently unstable a realization that deeply affects how we understand the world **Race and Restoration** Barclay Key, 2020-05-06 From the late nineteenth century to the dawn of the civil rights era the Churches of Christ operated outside of conventional racial customs Many of their congregations even deep in the South counted whites and blacks among their numbers As the civil rights movement began to challenge pervasive social views about race Church of Christ leaders and congregants found themselves in the midst of turmoil In Race and Restoration Churches of Christ and the Black Freedom Struggle Barclay Key focuses on how these churches managed race relations during the Jim Crow era and how they adapted to the dramatic

changes of the 1960s Although most religious organizations grappled with changing attitudes toward race the Churches of Christ had singular struggles Fundamentally restorationist these exclusionary churches perceived themselves as the only authentic expression of Christianity compelling them to embrace peoples of different races even as they succumbed to prevailing racial attitudes The Churches of Christ thus offer a unique perspective for observing how Christian fellowship and human equality intersected during the civil rights era Key reveals how racial attitudes and practices within individual congregations elude the simple categorizations often employed by historians Public forums designed by churches to bridge racial divides offered insight into the minds of members while revealing the limited progress made by individual churches Although the Churches of Christ did have a more racially diverse composition than many other denominations in the Jim Crow era Key shows that their members were subject to many of the same aversions prejudices and fears of other churches of the time Ironically the tentative biracial relationships that had formed within and between congregations prior to World War II began to dissolve as leading voices of the civil rights movement prioritized desegregation *Gateway to Equality* Keona K. Ballantyne, 2024-05-01 Radical Volunteers tells the largely unknown story of century southern student activism in Tennessee between the Brown decision in 1954 and the national backlash against the Kent State University shootings in May 1970 As one of the first statewide studies of student activism and one of the few examinations of southern student activism it broadens scholarly understanding of New Left and Black student radicalism from its traditionally defined hotbeds in the Northeast and on the West Coast By incorporating accounts of students from both historically Black and predominantly white colleges and universities across Tennessee Radical Volunteers places events that might otherwise appear random and intermittent into conversation with one another This methodological approach reveals that students joined organizations and became activists in an effort to assert their autonomy and as a result student power became a rallying cry across the state Katherine J Ballantyne illuminates a broad movement comprised of many different sorts of students white and Black private and public western middle and east Tennesseans Importantly Ballantyne does not confine her analysis to just campuses Indeed Radical Volunteers also situates campus activism within their broader communities Tennessee student activists built upon relationships with Old Left activists and organizations thereby fostering their otherwise fledgling enterprises and creating the possibility for radical change in the politically conservative region But framing student activism over a long period of time across Tennessee as a whole reveals disjuncture as much as coherence in the movement Though all case studies contain particular and representative features Tennessee's diversity lends itself well to a study of regional variations While outnumbered Tennessee student activists secured significant campus reforms pursued

ambitious community initiatives and articulated a powerful countervision for the South and the United States

Cable, 2023-12-15 Historians of the American South have come to consider the mechanization and consolidation of cotton farming the Southern enclosure movement to be a watershed event in the region s history In the decades after World War II this transition pushed innumerable sharecroppers tenant farmers and smallholders off the land redistributing territory and resources upward to a handful of large mainly white operators By disproportionately displacing Black farmers enclosure also slowed the progress of the civil rights movement and limited its impact John Cable s Southern Enclosure is among the first studies to explore that process through the interpretive lens of settler colonialism Focusing on east central Mississippi home of the Mississippi Band of Choctaw Indians Cable situates enclosure in the long history of dispossession that began with Indian Removal The book follows elite white landowners and Black and Choctaw farmers from

World War II to 1960 the period when the old labor intensive farm structure collapsed By acknowledging that this process occurred on taken land Cable demonstrates that the records of agricultural agents segregationist politicians and the Bureau of Indian Affairs BIA are traces of ongoing colonization The settler colonial framework rarely associated with the postwar South sheds important light on the shifting categories of race and class It also prompts comparisons with other settler societies states in southern and eastern Africa for instance whose timelines racial regimes and agrarian transitions were similar to those of the South This postwar history of the South suggests ways in which the BIA's termination policy dovetailed with Southern segregationism and at the same time points to some of the shortcomings of the burgeoning field of settler colonial studies Hazel Brannon Smith Jeffery B. Howell, 2017-03-22 Hazel Brannon Smith 1914 1994 stood out as a prominent white newspaper owner in Mississippi before during and after the civil rights movement As early as the mid 1940s she earned state and national headlines by fighting bootleggers and corrupt politicians Her career was marked by a progressive ethic and she wrote almost fifty years of columns with the goal of promoting the health of her community In the first half of her career she strongly supported Jim Crow segregation Yet in the 1950s she refused to back the economic intimidation and covert violence of groups such as the Citizens Council The subsequent backlash led her to being deemed a social pariah and the economic pressure bankrupted her once flourishing newspaper empire in Holmes County Rejected by the white establishment she became an ally of the black struggle for social justice Smith's biography reveals how many historians have miscast white moderates of this period Her peers considered her a liberal but her actions revealed the firm limits of white activism in the rural South during the civil rights era While historians have shown that the civil rights movement emerged mostly from the grass roots Smith s trajectory was decidedly different She never fully escaped her white paternalistic sentiments yet during the 1950s and 1960s she spoke out consistently against racial extremism This book complicates the narrative of the white media and business people responding to the movement's challenging call for racial **From Slavery to Segregation** Keith M. Finley, 2024-10-03 Keith M Finley's From Slavery to Segregation explores iustice the key features shaping southern politics during the nineteenth and twentieth centuries as explained in the South's defense of its racial systems It treats slavery and segregation as part of the same whole rather than as discrete institutions rooted in different periods In the process the book uncovers the deep historical origins of the region s states rights philosophy and the unfortunate persistence of a culture dominated by calls for white supremacy While highlighting the broad overview of southern racial and political thought Finley underscores the larger American struggle with racial injustice which although most pronounced in the South afflicted the entire nation The South's defense of chattel slavery became a natural model for the region s defense of segregation during the Jim Crow era Through a comparative analysis of the rhetoric employed in the justification of both racial institutions Finley reveals elements of continuity and change in the region s identity Ultimately he shows how the history of the twentieth century South is irreparably linked to the century before it For instance one cannot

understand the ferocity of resistance to the Supreme Court's 1954 Brown v Board decision without being aware of how and why the South emerged as it did after the Civil War The Old South and the New South shared a similar constellation of ideas that informed arguments advancing their respective race based social orders which took the form of a commonality of perception regarding race a sense of being assailed by outsiders and a series of appeals to the highest secular authority in the pantheon of regional and American beliefs the Constitution Discontinuity however marked the long term strategies of both the prewar and postwar South Although segregationists sought to preserve the racial status quo as did their forebears they ultimately relented when confronted with federal power and grudgingly shifted toward a narrative that less often foregrounded race when championing states rights
