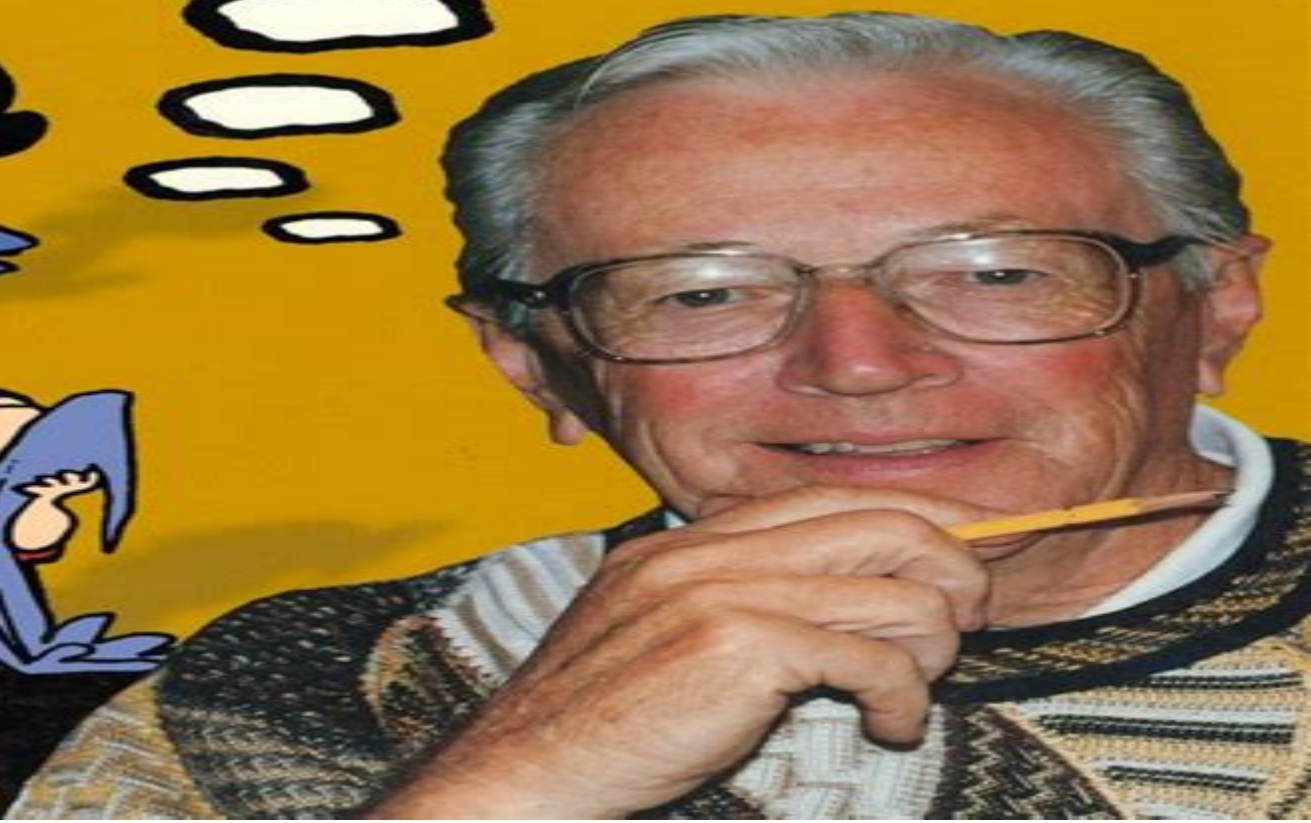

Thomas Inge,2011-09-15 Will Eisner s innovations in the comics especially the comic book and the graphic novel as well as his devotion to comics analysis make him one of comics first true auteurs and the cartoonist so revered and influential that cartooning s highest honor is named
