Tanev, 2012-12-06 Although it took some time to establish the word photonics is both widely accepted and used throughout the world and a major area of activity concerns nonlinear materials In these the nonlinearity mainly arises from second order or third order nonlinear optical processes A restriction is that second order processes only occur in media that do not possess a centre of symmetry Optical fibres on the other hand being made of silica glass created by fusing SiO₂ molecules are made of material with a centre of z symmetry so the bulk of all processes are governed by third order nonlinearity Indeed optical fibre nonlinearities have been extensively studied for the last thirty years and can be truly hailed as a success story of nonlinear optics In fact the fabrication of such fibres and the exploitation of their nonlinearity is in an advanced stage not least being their capacity to sustain envelope solitons What then of second order nonlinearity This is also well known for its connection to second harmonic generation It is an immediate concern however to understand how waves can mix and conserve both energy and momentum of the photons involved The problem is that the

wave vectors cannot be made to match without a great deal of effort or at least some clever arrangement has to be made a special geometry or crystal arrangement The whole business is called phase matching and an inspection of the state of the art today reveals the subject to be in an advanced state

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
