<u>Underground</u> Blake Atwood,2021-09-28 How Iranians forged a vibrant informal video distribution infrastructure when their government banned all home video technology in 1983 In 1983 the Iranian government banned the personal use of home video technology In Underground Blake Atwood recounts how in response to the ban technology enthusiasts cinephiles entrepreneurs and everyday citizens forged an illegal but complex underground system for video distribution Atwood draws on archival sources including trade publications newspapers memoirs films and laws but at the heart of the book lies a corpus of oral history interviews conducted with participants in the underground He argues that videocassettes helped to
